

LEE COUNTY SHUFFLEBOARD CLUB  
MINUTES FOR GENERAL MEETING ON NOVEMBER 3, 2018

The meeting was called to order by John Holder, President, at 11:30 a.m.

The minutes of the last general meeting were read by John Eck and accepted as read.

The financial report was read by Rita Wilson showing a balance of \$7,628.61. The report has been posted on the bulletin board.

John Holder said all board members were doing a great job.

John Klinger needs help with daily play as he is spending much too much time at the courts. Volunteers are needed to open for daily play.

The courts will be closed November 9-10 for resurfacing.

There were conflicting statements concerning whether the courts were sealed after being repainted. John Eck said that the courts were sealed shortly after being repainted as he was present when that happened. He also said that in his opinion the chlorine solution he saw left on the courts by the person doing the pressure cleaning was the cause of the problems with the courts. John Holder then said that in the future the pressure cleaning would be done prior to the courts being sealed before the beginning of the next season.

Lee county may try evening shuffleboard play for children in the summer.

John Holder said the new roof would have fans and the existing court structures would be removed.

The water cooler in the equipment building is not working and after conflicting comments by Lee county personnel, it was determined that the Lee County Shuffle Board Club is responsible for the water cooler. It was moved and seconded to buy a new water cooler.

There was a discussion about teaching new people about shuffleboard, including the availability of books about shuffleboard. It was noted that there used to be a fairly large library of shuffleboard books in the equipment shed, but there are none now. It was said that the books were in a desk drawer in the clubhouse. (After the meeting, the desk drawers were examined and found to contain only 2 books).

The meeting was adjourned at 11:55.
